

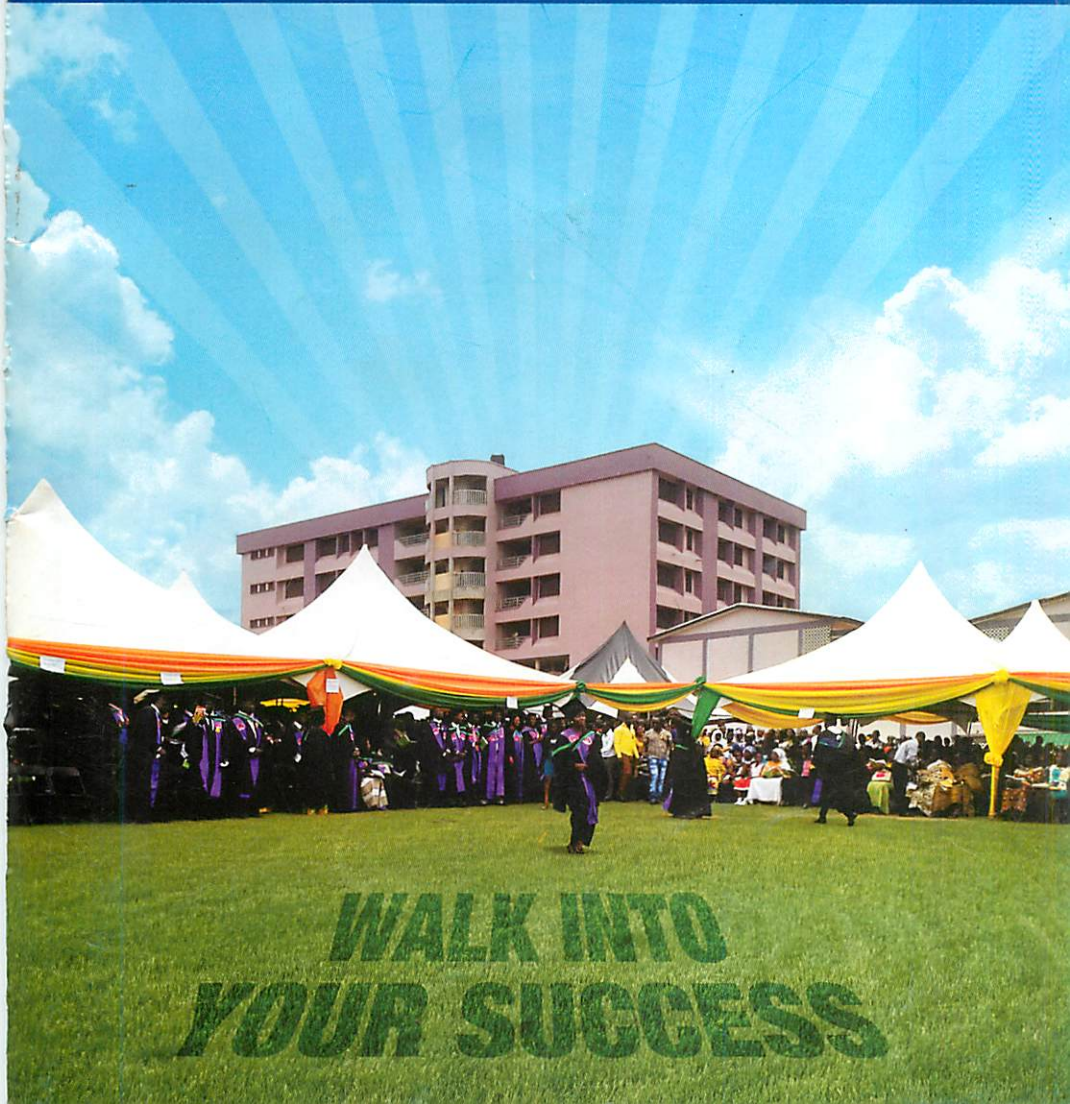




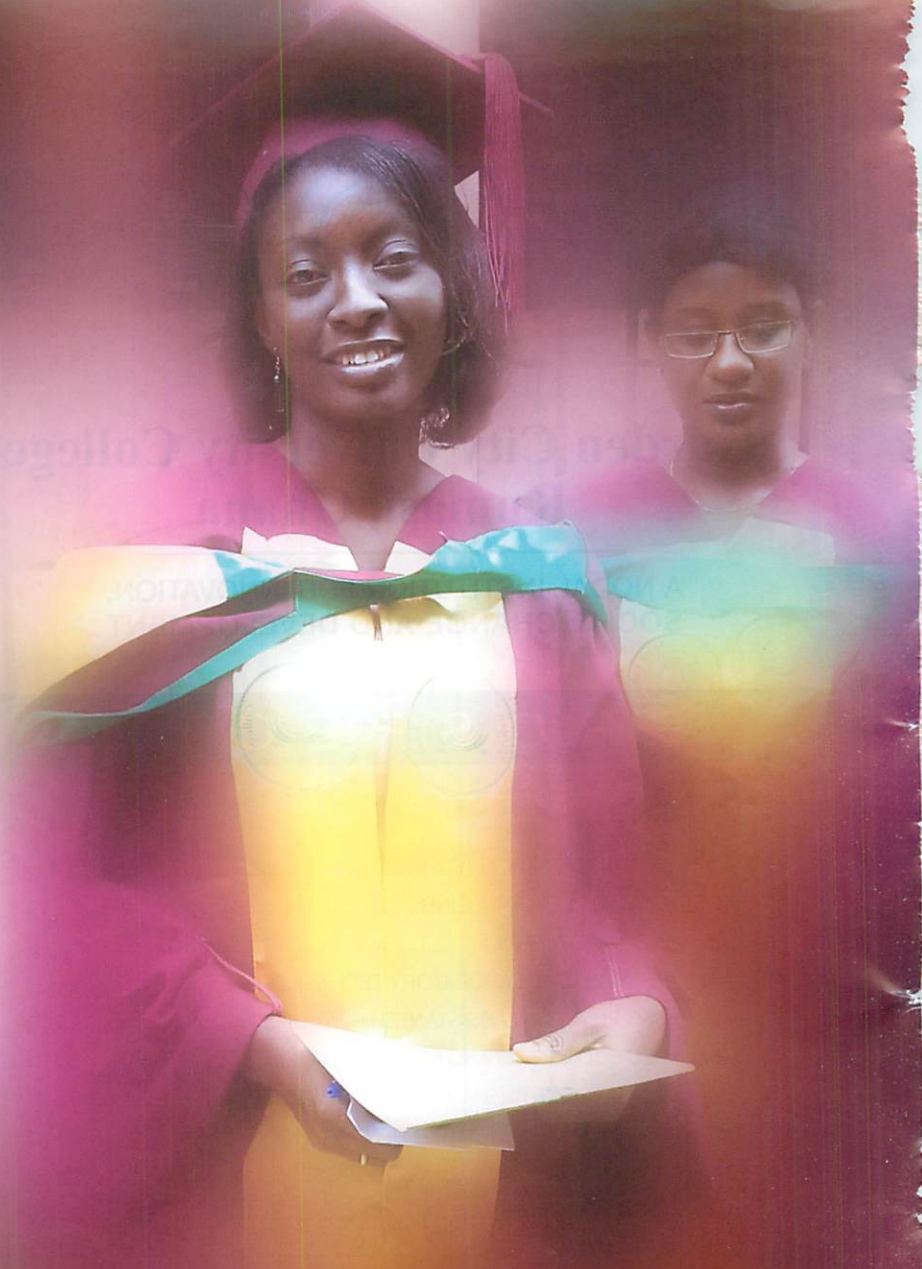

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COMPUTER SCIENCE & INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

West African Senior Secondary Certificate Exams (WASSCE)

Six credit passes with an aggregate not exceeding 36. The subjects should include Mathematics, English, Integrated Science and any three elective subjects.

General Certificate of Education (GCE)

For candidates who possess the General Certificate of Education (G.C.E.), the admission requirements are:

FIVE Ordinary Level credits in General Certificate of Education (G.C.E.) Examination or its equivalent including English Language and Mathematics, and

THREE passes at the Advanced Level in General Certificate of Education (G.C.E.) examination including Mathematics. At least one of the grades must be a D or better.

Mature Students

A mature student must:

Be at least 25 years

Have five passes in Ordinary Level/WASSCE or its equivalent including English Language and Mathematics, and

Have at least 2 years of working experience in a relevant profession.

The applicant must also pass the Mature Students' Entrance Examination, which comprises of:

General Paper (including a section of English Language and Mathematics)

Diploma holders

Candidates with GCE ordinary level or SSSCE plus any of the following qualifications will be admitted to level 100 but may qualify for exemption to level 200 or 300:

- Diploma from a recognized University
- Higher National Diploma (at least a Second Class Lower Division) with 2 years' relevant work experience
- Transfer from a recognized university
- Intermediate stage of a professional certificate, for example City & Guilds,
- A-Plus, Network plus, MCSE

Foreign Students

Foreign students may be considered for admission if they hold qualifications equivalent to those stated above, provided they are proficient in English Language.

Entry Requirements for Admission of Students

Senior Secondary School Certificate (SSSCE)

Credit passes in three Core subjects i.e. Mathematics, English, and Integrated Science plus **three** electives subjects in General Science, Business, Technical Skills, Vocational Skills, with an aggregate score not exceeding 24.

Entrants shall have;

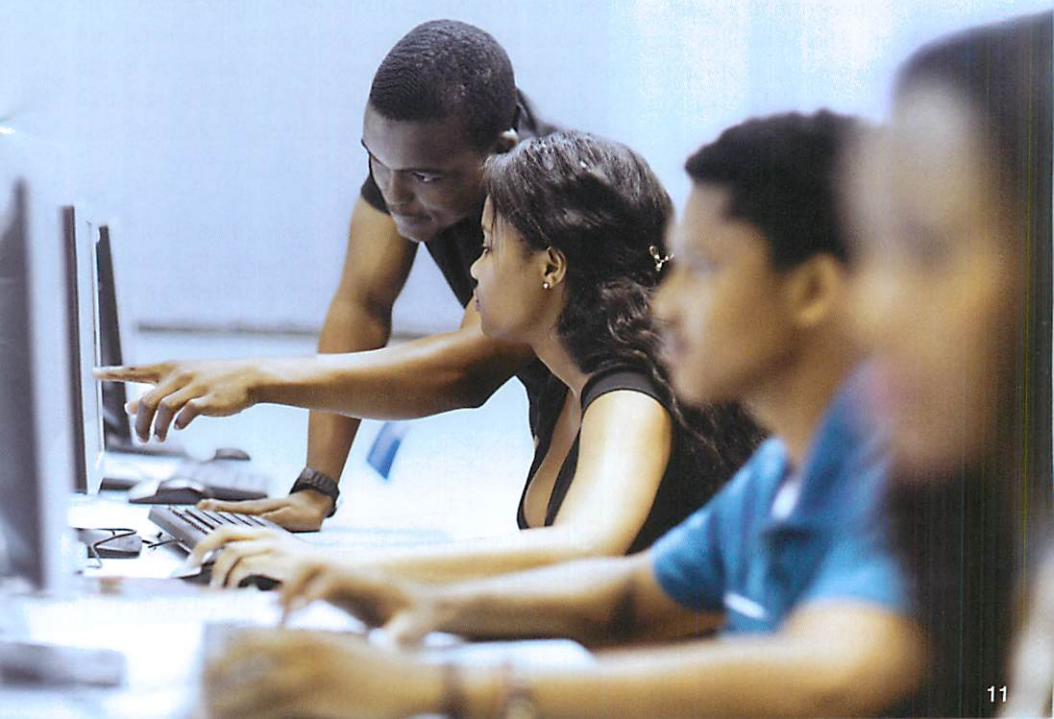

B.Sc. Midwifery

With the changing needs of society and the emergence of new health problems, there is the need for the training of midwives with the requisite knowledge and skills to meet these challenging needs of society. The Garden City University runs a four year Bachelor of Science degree in midwifery.

Career opportunities

Career opportunities exist with governmental and non-governmental agencies e.g. MOH, GHS and Religious bodies. Graduates can also go into private practice. To achieve these, the Garden City University College is working closely with all stakeholders e.g. MOH, GHS, NMC to enhance the smooth recruitment of student.

Entry requirements

- i. Applicant must have Senior High School Certificate (SSSCE) and/or West African Secondary School Certificate Examination (WASSCE) with aggregate 24 or better which should include credit passes in the three core: English Language, Mathematics and Integrated Science and credit passes in three (3) elective subjects in the following: Elective Mathematics, Chemistry, Biology and Physics, Home Science (Food and Nutrition), General Agriculture with Physics and Chemistry, General Arts or as may be directed.
- ii. Holders of Diploma in Midwifery certificate from a recognized institution would enter the programme at Level 300(third year) after a successful examination and interview. Such applicants must have graduated with a minimum Cumulative Weighted Average (CWA) of 65% or Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5 to guarantee placement at Level 300.
- iii. State Registered Nurse Midwives may be considered for admission into level 200 (second year) after a successful entrance examination.

MEDICAL LABORATORY TECHNOLOGY AND PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTSHIP

BSc Medical Laboratory Technology

The training of Medical Laboratory personnel at the degree level has always fallen short of the required levels needed in the country, and appears to have been neglected for so long. Again, with modern technological advances in medicine, the horizon of biomedical scientists is constantly expanding and the body of knowledge pertinent to the different disciplines continues to increase, to the extent that the previously under-trained personnel lack the requisite knowledge to match up with modern diagnostic approaches, and therefore the need to upgrade their knowledge and professional skills.

It is the goal of this course of study to equip the students with the necessary knowledge and skills to perform competently in all disciplines of medical laboratory practice, and in all areas of laboratory diagnosis and research.

Career Prospects/Employment Opportunities

The medical laboratory offers a career full of various options. Employment opportunities exist in governmental, quasi-governmental and private agencies (e.g. MOH, GHS, Teaching Hospitals, Religious bodies, etc.) at their hospital laboratories, including private clinical laboratories. To achieve these, the Garden City University College is working closely with all relevant stakeholders to facilitate the smooth recruitment of graduates.

Entry Requirements

Applicants must have either:

- i. Senior High School Certificate (SSSCE) and/or West African Secondary School Certificate Examination (WASSCE) with aggregate 24 or better which should include **credits in the three core subjects** (i.e. English Language, Mathematics and Integrated Science) plus credits in three (3) elective subjects in the following: Biology [OR Home Science(Food and Nutrition) OR General Agriculture], Chemistry, and Physics [OR Elective Mathematics].
- ii. Mature candidate holding a Diploma in Medical Laboratory Technology or HND in Science Laboratory Technology obtained from a recognized institution of higher learning, with at least one year post qualification experience in a hospital laboratory may be eligible for admission to level 200 (2nd year) of the program.

Applicants should not be less than 25 years of age, and **must have passed an entrance examination and/or admission interview.**

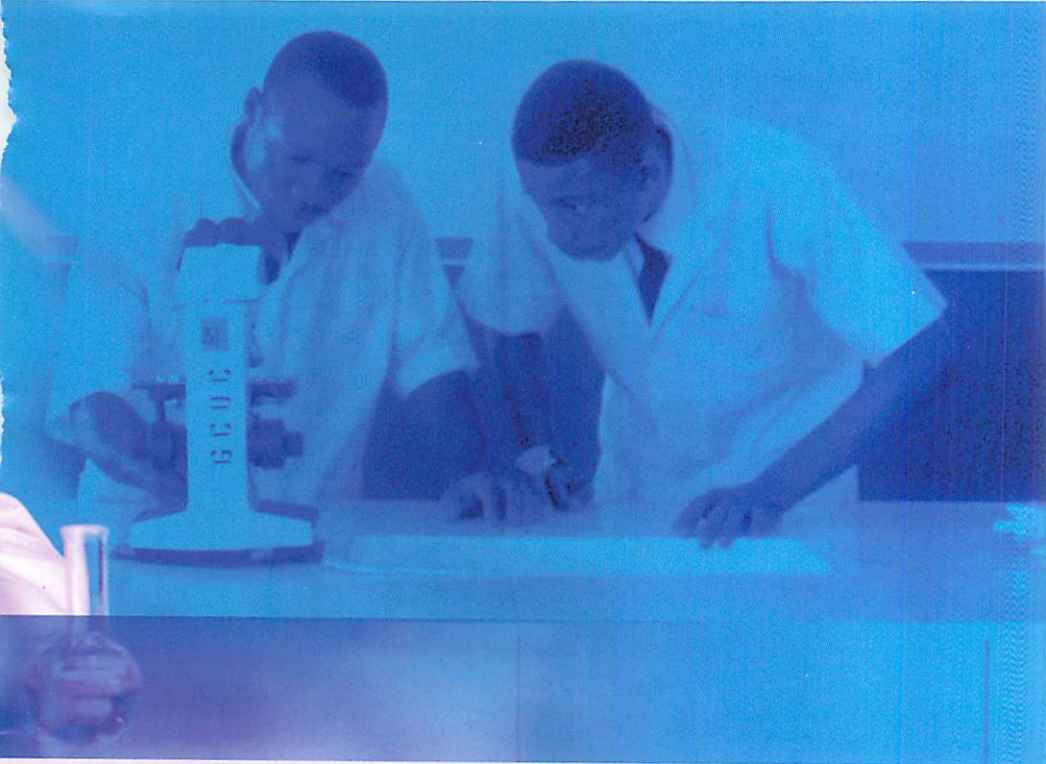
- iii. Mature candidates with a Certificate in Medical Laboratory Technology with at least two years post qualification experience would start from first year (level 100). They would be required to pass an entrance examination and /or an admission interview.

Foreign students shall provide their high school certificates/diplomas and transcripts; all of which must be translated into English with an accompanying statement showing how their system equates to the Ghanaian system.

There are also opportunities available in the armed forces, crime and forensic departments of the police service, food and drug industries, as well as research and pharmaceutical laboratories where the laboratory Scientist may be involved in laboratory testing to develop new healthcare products or pharmaceutical agents.

Positions are also available to serve in clinical and administrative support roles or as technical representatives for laboratory instrumentation companies where one may train other laboratory professionals on new methods or instruments or trouble-shoot those analyzers that are malfunctioning.

Positions also exist for qualified Medical Laboratory Technologists or Biomedical scientists in education and teaching (in both private and public health training and educational institutions) where students are taught the theory and laboratory exercises essential to the laboratory profession.

By virtue of the entrepreneurial skills offered by the program, graduate Medical Laboratory Technologists can also go into independent practice.

In addition to immediate employment opportunities, graduates are prepared and motivated to pursue postgraduate education, including advanced degrees in public/community health, administration and the medical school.

Entry requirements

- i. Applicant must have Senior High School Certificate (SSSCE) aggregate 24 or West African Secondary School Certificate Examination (WASSCE) with aggregate 36 or better which should include credits in three core: English Language, Mathematics and Integrated Science and three elective subjects in the following: Chemistry, Biology Elective Mathematics or Physics.
- ii. State Registered Nurses (SRN) and Registered Midwives will receive exemptions from the level 100 courses and be eligible for admission to level 200.
- iii. Medical Assistant and General Nursing Diploma as well as Bachelor degree holders in life sciences (Biochemistry, Biological sciences, Sports and Exercise Medicine, Psychology) will be considered for admission to level 300 of the programme and will as such be able to complete the programme in two years.
- iv. Mature applicants must be at least 25 years at the time of admission and must possess either five credits at GCE O-Level including English language and Mathematics or WASSCE/SSSCE with credits in three core subjects (English, Mathematics and Integrated science) plus three elective subjects (Chemistry, Biology Mathematics or Physics).
- v. Foreign student may be considered for admission if they hold qualification equivalent to those stated above, provided they are proficient in English. Equivalent qualifications include; A-levels, High School Diplomas.

Programme structure

The programme, a four year (eight semester) curriculum consist of an initial intense basic and biomedical sciences namely; physics, chemistry, biology, anatomy, biochemistry, physiology, pathology, pharmacology and microbiology. This will be followed by clinical rotations. In the clinical years, practical rotations will run concurrently instructive sessions that emphasize history taking and clinical examination, diagnostics, medical ethics and systemic diseases. Clinical rotations will be in the following fields; Internal Medicine, Surgery, Child Health, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Emergency Medicine, Family Medicine, Tropical Medicine and Community Health. Students will be expected to have supervised hands-on experience in acquiring the needed clinical skills for practice.

BSc Physician Assistantship Studies

A Physician Assistant is a mid-level medical practitioner who works under the supervision of a licensed physician. Physician Assistants take medical histories, perform physical examinations, and order and analyse diagnostic data such as laboratory tests and imaging studies. They also perform therapeutic procedures such as suturing, removal of minor lesions and casting. The Physician Assistant develops and implements a treatment plan and makes appropriate decisions regarding referral and findings to the supervising physician. Physician Assistants also prescribe medication.

The physician assistant programme in the Garden City University College is a four year (eight semesters) programme that will adequately prepare the students for their future roles in clinical practice or offer the foundation for upgrade to the medical profession.

Career opportunities and progression

Career opportunities exist with governmental and non-governmental agencies e.g. MOH, GHS and Health Institutions. Graduates can also go into private practice. To achieve these, the Garden City University College is working closely with all stakeholders e.g. MOH, GHS, GMDC to enhance the smooth recruitment of student.

In addition to working in hospitals, polyclinics and private medical centers, Physician Assistants (PA) are trained to function in a variety of settings such as: Clinics and NGO/Faith-based Clinics, Emergency Health Care Organizations, Community Health Centers, Industry and Branches of the Armed Services. Private practice should be under the supervision of a licensed physician after serving for a mandatory number of years as will be defined by the Ghana Medical and Dental Council.

Physician Assistant graduates may seek to progress clinically or into academia. Postgraduate study in human sciences, public health, as well as clinical subspecialties such as emergency medicine, primary care, etc. will be options to consider.
